Geoff Wiklund with wife Joanne, alongside Greg Simnor with wife Danielle, and Jeannette Ward provided a wonderful platform of ministry, each with their own style. They interacted together to build a powerful podium for our Lord Jesus Christ to minister through the FGBMFI National Convention held in the Solway Park Hotel in Masterton, over Queens Birthday weekend. In a

single statement, I would say all three speakers focused on that important message of love. Love, seasoned with the grace of our Lord Jesus Christ.

Geoff, a successful pastor and teacher, now retired to Kerikeri fed us from his rich storehouse of treasure when he spoke in the three sessions scheduled for him.

The challenge he brought to the men on Friday afternoon was that of "A man and his Integrity" based on Job 2:9 and Job 27:5 where Job said 'I will not put away integrity from me' when faced with his many challenges.

Geoff challenged all present to "Hold fast to Integrity" and, to keep our integrity, we need a Holy Spirit answer. (1): We need to pay our tax. Pay what is due and give honour to God. (2): Testing. Do what is right but, receive grace and show mercy to others. When we do wrong or fail, God does not condemn. Keep coming back to Him and let Him

change us. Our faith becomes real as we are tested, humble ourselves and are graciously restored. (3): Tithes. Be faithful in this area of our lives. God, "tests us in all the little things". (4): Training, "let your words and your works speak". Look at what you have got and multiply it.

Perfection: Geoff encouraged us all to: "Ask God to

give you the right thing for you to do". Perfection comes when working in tandem with God's plan in your life. Also; "We need to make the <u>choice</u> of integrity". Job prayed for his friends – then God released His glory on him

Geoff's ministry over the weekend was powerful, sowing seeds into our lives with wonderful words of

encouragement. Referring to the metaphor of the potter and the clay, he said: "Flick out the impurities of your life, as the potter does with the clay, to perfect a vessel. Stop trying to make yourself. You feel worse as <u>you</u> try harder. Try surrendering harder. It is the power of God that makes the difference. Sin is easy to spot, look for the grace.

Another amazing convention that was so impacting and empowering for all who wanted to receive.

Inviting Jesus In

I was a bonny bouncing blue eyed baby boy born in Ranfurly (renowned for hoar frosts), in Central

Otago. My mum recalls the winter I was born. She was a bit slow in letting go the clothes tub water on the outside of the house. The water staved frozen for six weeks. I was the fifth child. My parents acquired a 99vear lease on 700 acres on the Blue Mountains, Tapanui, West Otago: a virgin block of mainly tussock. With a team of draught horses Dad cultivated that land that now, 70 years later, grows beautiful grass and well maintained Pinus radiata shelter belts.

After leaving school at 14, I spent some time in the high country and returned home to go into partnership with my parents.

However, in 1970 farming did not paint a pretty picture, so when Brenda and I got married we

chose instead to have an extended honeymoon in Australia for 18 months travelling the perimeter

and then up the middle.

Our mother had encouraged all 7 of us children, to undertake Sunday school by correspondence for 10 years, resulting in us knowing it was right to attend church on Sundays.

On our returning from Australia we moved into the high country, attending church regularly. I was confirmed in the Anglican Church in Pleasant Point. Moving to the Waikato we attended a house group of all young marrieds. There were many social events including ten pin bowling, white water rafting, indoor cricket and church services together. At a

service in Hamilton a preacher spoke of Daniel in the lions' den followed by an altar call. Brenda and



I were at opposite ends of the pew but God called us up together, the first of many many people who responded to the call to repent, believe, receive and invite Jesus into our lives and hearts.

What changed? My pack of dogs were looking at me sideways, no more well-chosen expletives. I would like to say I always kept my eyes and life fixed on Jesus and I did try to do so. But I often found myself saying: "Sorry, Lord".



We were blessed in business owning our own farms, and blessed with four healthy children. They have permission to correct me. We are all Christians.

Sadly, while travelling in Crete with our eldest daughter, Sarah, and her husband Aaron, Brenda tripped on the uneven footpath and broke her arm and bruised her breast. The bruising resulted in cancer. After radiation and chemotherapeutic treatment, she developed leukaemia. Her sister in Australia was a suitable bone marrow donor, but, sadly, after some time, her body rejected it. My

Brenda died after 3 good years at 58 years old after 35 years of marriage. It was my privilege to be married to such a great girl, wife, mother and grandmother. My children said to me: "Now dad you are mother and father" and they have held me to it. We all communicate every week. Now with grandchildren, some have in fact shown their own genuine love and learning about Jesus.

and heaps of children. She was also involved in youth ministry which both of us had been doing for more than twenty years.

Although I was semi-retired we bought a beef and sheep unit and reared in excess of one hundred calves each year and fattened cattle. Over the past few years we have reduced our sheep numbers but increased cattle. For 30 years I have been breeding Piedmont cattle from the Piedmont Valley in Italy. In 1988 I bought and imported a heifer for \$50,000 with embryos, donors and recipient surrogate heifers. I then direct marketed beef to butchers' shops. I have only quit this recently and we intend trying semi-retirement again.

We are blessed with a new house and gardens built by Diane. This is a home God has provided for his use and each week we have many guests here at our banqueting table.

I am still very involved in church and FGBMFI. I first joined FGBMFI 45 years ago. The founder of the organisation was Demos Shakarian, maybe one of the biggest dairy farmers in the USA during his lifetime, so that naturally appealed to me. At FGB meetings men share their stories to encourage other men to get to know our best friend Jesus Christ.

John 3: 16 For God so loved the world that he gave his one and only Son, so that whoever believes in him shall not perish but have eternal life.

We have 76,000 people here in Rotorua. Surely it is God's desire that all people at least hear of, learn more about and be encouraged to come into God's Kingdom. I am praying for that to happen in Rotorua.

Graham Eagle (Napier)

On his return from America in the late eighties, Graham quickly became involved in the Napier Chapter of FGBMFI. He was the vice-president when Napier hosted the National Convention for the first time. At the end of the 1990s he became President of the Chapter for a couple of years before being elected onto the National Board. He always had a practical impact at the local level which he carried out quietly and without any fuss. Prior to the era of emails, the printing and mailing out of the monthly newsletters was always done through his factory at his expense. He even provided prepaid envelopes for the mailing out. He was always available to pick up speakers who were touring the country from Taupo or Palmerston North and would always accommodate them. He hosted regional meetings at his home each year even though he wasn't the Regional Director.

Graham always supported the local chapter dinner meetings and the fact that he didn't attend the Napier meeting after the Ashurst Camp and a few days before his sudden death surprised the local members.

Having Graham as the National President allowed the Hawkes Bay chapters to keep up with the play as he always reported back from Dominion Council meetings, his travels overseas and other developments that he was privy to.

His presence working quietly behind the scenes in the Hawkes Bay area will be sorely missed.

After serving as the Regional Director for the Hawkes Bay, Graham was appointed a National Director of the fellowship at the Palmerston North convention in 2003. When Alex Moody stood down as National President in 2005, Graham was asked by the National Board to take over the reins as the National President. Graham continued as National President until his death earlier this year.

Graham was much loved throughout the fellowship. He was always prepared to go and share his story around the country of how God lifted him from the rubbish dump to the board room. He never forgot his humble beginnings and loved serving the God that turned his life around.

Graham was a great story teller, a hard worker, honest and direct, a big picture person – he didn't like getting bogged down in the details, and he was open about his own shortcomings. He will be missed by many and the fellowship has lost a true Full Gospel Business Man.
